Promised - Deuteronomy 32:48-52; 34:4-7

2-23-20

I. A Sin Recalled - Dt. 32:48-52

- 1. Here is an account of the death of Moses just as Aaron his brother had died -without entering the promised land
 - -the reason given, was that Moses did not uphold God's "holiness" (verse 51)
- 2. This passage is between the two great songs of Moses Song #1 - Dt 32:1-43 Song #2 Dt 32:1-20 the song of Moses blossing
 - Song #2 Dt 33:1-29 the song of Moses blessing

3. First song

Threats and warnings

-judgments - God punishes us

4. Second Song

A joyful song - God loves and blesses Israel

God honors His covenant with Israel

- 5. Both songs are true and both are "good"
- -truth is often negative... for example, the truth that people get sick and die is negative, but reality (truth)
- Rea 6. By Moses NOT entering the promised land a lesson is taught
 - -God's truth does not spare even the greatest among us
 - -God's truth is just that... truth (like it or not)
 - 7. Most of us die with some regrets or some memories of things we wish we'd done differently joys and sadness mingled

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. Consider your own death when you pass do you have regrets? can you share those?
- 2. Do you see how your past sins limit your future growth? your future potential?
- 3. Moses was just like us he was not perfect

II. A Future Glimpsed - Dt. 34:4

- 1. God was about to fulfill His promises
 - -Moses would not experience it, only "see" it
- 2. Genesis 13:14-15 is a promise to the patriarchs
- 3. Ana and Simeon got to "see" the Messiah Luke 2:25-35 -they had many expectations
 - -their expectations were the same for so many of the Jewish nation for years

they

lived (and died) looking forward to the fulfillment of God's promises -they experienced just a small token of the Messiah's promised land

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. We are promised heaven... but have to die to experience it
- 2. We are promised (also) a second coming... many have died without experiencing His return
- 3. Moses makes no comment back to God what might he have been thinking on this day?

III. A Man Remembered - Dt. 34:5-7

Rea

1. Moses died

"He" buried him - someone else or God?

- No one knows where the grave is but God only
- No shrine may be made to Moses
- 2. He lived in good health until it was his time

-the fact that he had strength speaks to the power God gave him in later life to accomplish all that He required of him

- 3. The funeral weeping lasted 30 days (verse 8)
- 4. Verses 10-12 are a eulogy to Moses as a great "prophet" -a great hero

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. What is a hero? what character traits go to make one? -compare Spiderman to Moses (as heros)
- 2. The man dies, but so does an era all God's eras are good ones, and He anoints and chooses just such people to lead His people through
 - -God chooses pastors to lead churches in our day
- 3. He is honored, but not idolized that is significant
- 4. To honor our leaders is great but there are dangers. What do you see as a danger of idolizing our past leaders? What is the danger of not honoring such leaders?
