### I. Called Out - Ezekiel 11:2-4

- 1. Received a message (verse 2)
  - A. Addressed as "Son of Man"
  - B. From the "Lord"
  - C. Recipients are men who are plotting evil
    - -giving wrong advice

Rea

- D. There are always false prophets wolves, hirelings, the Anti-Christ -Satan himself is an angel of "light"
- 2. Haven't our houses been rebuilt? (Verse 3)
  - A. If a question these evil men are saying... we've just begun to rebuild
  - B. If a statement they are mocking we've not rebuilt...have we?
- 3. We are meat in a pot
  - -the best of times are coming... we are "the meat in the pot" the best
- 4. Ezekiel's task prophecy against them (verse 4)
  - -the situation is not getting better
- Rea
- -speaking out against false prophets/ preachers/ leaders?
- Rea -we can always find someone to say what we want to listen to... there are "false churches" that major in "good news" but false news

# **Rea Ideas and Questions:**

- 1. Why is it so prevalent that there are bad leaders? in God's church?
- 2. We have to speak out? is that the meaning/application here?
- 3. The "good" man looks "bad" in this circumstance

### II. Gathered - Ezekiel 11:14-17

- 1. Repeated the word of the Lord came to me (verse 14)
- Rea
- -a bold and powerful claim...I'm bringing the word of the Lord
- 2. The fellow exiles have said they are far away from the Lord (verse 15)
  - -this land is our possession
- Rea
- -they "claim the promise" God has given us this land
- -they claim that these nay sayers are far away from the Lord
- Rea 3. Discuss how you can know if someone is "far away from the Lord"
  - -the message that this land is ours is a message that the hearers would want to get
  - 4. But "this is what the Sovereign Lord" says (verse 16)
- Rea
- -a contrast to what they are hearing
- -I have sent you away but I have been with you I've been a sanctuary for them where they have been exiled
- 5. They cannot worship in the Temple, so God Himself has been their sanctuary
- 6. Again uses the term "Sovereign Lord" this is what He says (verse 17)
  - -I will gather you back... home
  - -one day I will bring my people home
- 7. God will fulfill every promise He's ever made to us one day
  - -when we turn from images (verse 18) He will then restore us
- Rea 8. He has sent them away
  - He will restore them

#### Rea **Ideas and Ouestions:**

- 1. Obviously He is in charge of their circumstances and He will bring them back in due time
  - 2. The promise comes when things are bad, not when things are good
  - 3. Interestingly the false prophets tell of a return pretty much without God
  - 4. In the exile, God was their sanctuary... not a building

## III. Sanctified - Ezekiel 11:18-21

- 1. Their change of heart (verse 18)
  - A. Remove the idols
  - B. "Detestable" things
- Rea
- C. Note that they remove these idols not God -use their free-will to put them away
- 2. I will give them a new heart (verse 19)
  - A. Undivided
  - B. New spirit within
  - C. Remove their heart of stone
- 3. The problem: Rea
  - A. A stony heart
  - B. A divided heart versus genuine
  - C. Bad spirit inside
  - 4. Then: (verse 20)
    - A. They will follow the Lord's decrees
    - B. They will keep my laws
    - C. They will belong to me be MY people
    - D. Then I will be their God
- 5. Judging by verse 20 it seems that it might be easy to tell who belonged to the Lord Rea -you KNOW a tree by its fruit
  - -these are actions, not good intentions we are spoiled and rotten with "good intentions"
  - -what might we say to someone who said well I always wanted to do the right thing... but just never got around to it?
  - 6. God will bring down on their heads what the idols worshipers have done (verse 21)
    - A. Followed vile images and detestable idols
    - B. Declares the Sovereign Lord

-same title again... this is the third time in this week's lesson Rea

Rea

C. Very simply God rewards good for those who repent God rewards bad for those who are "devoted" to idols

You can tell who's "devoted" by how they act - fruit

### Rea **Ideas and Questions:**

- 1. God is no dummy He knows if we are "devoted" to false things or not -but, people are often "self-deceived"
- 2. How can you tell what a person is "devoted to?"
- 3. The judgement of God in verse 21 is to topple their own building on their own heads
- 4. Actions speak louder than words
