I. The Trap Set - Dan. 6:10-14

1. He learned - about the edict (verse 10)

-he knew it could not be changed - so he prayed

-but... this is not the first time he had prayed - it was a habit - discuss how the

"habit" of prayer is a good thing

2. Prayed

-private

-regularly - three times a day

-thanks to God

-toward Jerusalem

-"just as he had done before" - he maintained this spiritual discipline - not just an escape hatch

3. They found him praying (verse 11)

-"caught" him?? 4. They go to the king (**verse 12**)

-did you not make a decree

-the guilty will be thrown in the lion's den

5. Daniel "pays no attention to you" (verse 13)

-attempt to make this a personal attack on the king

- 6. The king's reaction (verse 14)
 - -distressed

-he was determined to help

-made every effort - a strategy of some type to save him

Rea Ideas and Questions:

1. They knew just when and where to find him

2. Do you have any enemies?

-discuss how their jealousy made them Daniel's enemy

-note, Daniel does not attack them... they attack him

-Satan is not inactive/ passive

3. Regular prayer is the issue

-not just lifting a prayer every now and then

II. The Door Shut - Dan. 6:15-18

1. They go and remind the king (verse 15)

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2. The king gave the order (verse 16)

-may God help you

3. He is "sealed" in (verse 17)

-with the king's seal - signet ring

-meant that this decision was made and no one might change it

- 4. He returns but cannot eat (verse 18) nor sleep
- -feels personally responsible for this

Rea -realizes he's been used

5. The writer makes the point that God is there even when He doesn't seem to be

Rea	-there is no word from God (at this point)	
Rea	Ideas and Questions:	
	1. Verse 18 ends in a dilemma - a catch 22	
	2. Note that Jesus (also) was shut in and sealed in the tomb	
	3. Caught by the words of his own mouth	
	4. Reference is made to God - may God help you	
III. The Tables are Turned - Dan. 6:19-24		
	1. Hurried to the lion's den (verse 19)	
Rea	-goes in hope??	
	2. Called out to Daniel and invokes the name of Daniel's God (verse 20)	
	A. Has your God saved you?	
Rea	B. When we get in tight places often our only hope is "God"	
	3. Has your God saved you?	
Rea	-is this statement to be understood that the king has faith in God?	
	4. Daniel answered (verse 21)	
	A. May you live forever	
Rea	-respectful answer, but I see a friendship also involved - he knew that the	
	king had struggled with this decision	
	B. God sent His angel and shut the mouth of the lions (verse 22)	
	-God had ruled and Daniel had been found innocent of the charges	
Rea	-discuss the jealousy of these enemies of Daniel	
	5. The king is overjoyed (verse 23)	
	-gave orders to take Daniel out of the den - no wound was found on him	
	-because he had trusted in God	
Rea	-the moral of the story - trust God even when He allows your enemies to throw	
	you into prison	
	6. God does not always remove us unharmed	
	-He does, however, always provide grace - 2 Cor. 12 - Paul's thorn was not	
	removed	
	7. Daniel's enemies were executed (verse 24)	
	-them and wives and children	
	-a harsh punishment but sensible to this king	
Rea	Ideas and Questions:	
	1. Is this jealousy or something else that caused them men to trap Daniel?	
	2. Daniel had a special relationship with King Darius - maybe his enemies were annoyed	
	by that - and sought a chance to elevate their own status	
	3. Perhaps the enemies of Daniel wanted the king to do something that Daniel was	
	opposed to - your enemies most often have a "reason." You may have spoken against	
	them and they could not "get you" at that time, but pledged to "get back."	
	4. We do not see our persecutors as enemies - why is that?	
	5. God made a way in an impossible circumstance
