I. The True God - Is. 46:3-7

1. Listen to me (**verse 3**)

-like "hear, Israel" - Dt. 6:4

-God tells them to trust Him because of His past help

2. Since your birth I've taken care of you

-He carries the people

Rea -as a mom might carry her young

3. Moves quickly to old age (verse 4)

-I will sustain you in your old age

Rea -He has taken care (past) and He will take care (future)

Rea -the future can be very scary - perhaps more so for the aged??

4. I made you

-instead of a god that they made

-"rescue" - save them in trouble

5. Comparative to God? (Verse 5)

-who can you even compare me to? - who is my equal?

6. Verse 5 - He begins the comparison with other gods

-verse 6 he tells the process of "making" a god

-gold and silver are "fashioned" by a man

-then, the people would worship this image

-it had to be carried from place to place (verse 7)

7. It cannot save them

Rea Ideas and Questions:

1. Comparing God to idols

-in your mind what is the biggest difference between an idol and God?

2. The promise of future care - just like past care

-trust/ faith are often future oriented - you have faith forward

-experiences are in our past

3. Discuss the needs of the gray haired

II. The Trustworthy One - Is. 46:8-11

1. Remember this... the next verses tell us what to remember (verse 8)

-calls them "rebels" - prone to wander, lord I feel it

2. Remember I am God (verse 9)

-like no other

Rea -in many ways the Bible is a history book. A book about the history of God's provision for mankind.

Rea -there is no other, - they don't even exist

3. I and my words/ purpose will stand (verse 10)

Rea -verse 10 is God's statement of His control over history, - what will happen so if He makes it known - reveals it, you can trust His word.

4. He will do what He has said (verse 11)

-summon a bird, or summon a man to do His bidding

Rea -idols have no control, and no power, but God has total control - all across history

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. God is trustworthy... how do we know that?
- 2. His will is done... He makes sure of that
 - -sometimes it is a long time coming even into eternity
- 3. So, you can trust His word/ words
- 4. You probably have a few very trustworthy persons in your circle of friends why are they so dear to you?

III. The Just One - Is. 46:12-13

1. Again He says "listen" - compare with verse 3 (verse 12)

Rea -again He calls them "rebels" (stubborn-hearted)

Rea 2. Discuss why mankind is so stubborn

Rea 3. One woman said she didn't need Google, her husband knew everything - sorry had to share it

4. I am bringing my salvation (verse 13)

-the word "deliverance" and salvation are very similar

-God would deliver ...count on it

5. Brings it to Zion and Israel

-brings it "near" - not far away

Rea -could be seen as a veiled reference to the Messiah (Jesus) - coming to Jerusalem/ Israel

Rea Ideas and Questions:

Rea

- 1. These two verses are a simple declaration there is no "if" you repent, or do something else God is about to do it
- 2. A rebuke for their stubbornness
- 3. Why are people so stubborn?
 - -why are the people of God so stubborn?
- 4. Is the salvation of God a positive thing or a negative thing?
