## **IV. Deserving Death - Romans 1:32**

1. Sometimes we know right and wrong, and God's place, but we don't care

- Rea 2. Holy Spirit is given to convince of righteousness, and judgement (to come)
  - 3. They not only do wrong, but they approve of those who do these things
- Rea -on television there is a "approving" club of those who are on the wrong track and boast in it
- Rea -this verse in KJV says these people "have pleasure" in these things instead of "approve" -some parade their unrighteousness
  - 4. They "deserve death"
- Rea -show by their actions they deserve death

## Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. Paul is arguing that salvation is for all but first in these first few chapters has to put all mankind in the same boat for all have sinned against God therefore we all deserve death
  - -after all the "wages of sin is death" Romans 3:23
- 2. Repentance of our sin allows us to be cleansed and begin a new life
- 3. A mind may be "darkened" but a mind can also be "enlightened" -and, by the way, YOU are the light of the world
- 4. The gospel message begins something like this "God loves you"
  - -God already loves them, but they don't know that they need to be "enlightened"
