	1. Post Ten Commands - that's what he refers to as "commands" in verse 1
	-keep them and the "laws"
Rea	-I think that these "laws" and "rules" need to be differentiated - for example, the
	Pharisees were into the "rules"
Rea	-Jesus said if you love me keep my "commandments" - "obedience" is still in play
	2. The laws are God-given and are "taught"
	-at Ex. 24:7 they promised to obey the laws
	3. Four benefits of obedience:
	A. We fear God
Rea	-keeping the law demonstrates reverence for God - we honor Him in this
	way - in the same way that we honor our parents by obeying them
	B. Lends itself to a long and full life
Rea	-"abundant life?" (John 10:10)
Rea	-that your joy may be "full" (1 John 1:4)
	C. Keeping His law leads to prosperity in the land
Rea	-not to slice too thin but the text actually says "that it may go well with
	thee" - not that you may be "prosperous" - they are two different things
	-the Bible never promises riches
Rea	-also, included idea is that the land is rich, but we must work it mine the
	riches from the land. There is something in YOUR hand - you must do
	something.
	D. You will increase greatly
Rea	-"increase" is not defined totally here
Rea	Ideas and Questions:
	1. What is said about these promises might be said about many other promises as well

- 2. "Obedience" does not mean there will be no struggle the land was filled with enemies that must be driven out
- 3. If you are a believer that does not mean you do not now have to struggle with the flesh the flesh and spirit war with one another inside us
- 4. How much money does it take to be "prosperous?"

## II. The Passion - Dt. 6:4-5

- 1. The Shema is verses 4-5
- 2. Options as to what the Shema means:
  - A. The Lord is one one God not separate persons
  - B. There is only one God
  - C. He is "one of a kind"
  - D. He has a single purpose

Rea

-all these are true... but our writer says that these are not the intended meaning

3. Lord means the same thing as the word "Yahweh"

"Yahweh is our God" - might be an acceptable translation

Verse 5 says that He is due our singular loyalty - just as a woman ought be

to her husband - He is our one and only God - singular devotion

# Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. God is "one" is similar to "I Am" not many but one
  - -He is and that is enough
- 2. Also:
  - -I am not I was, or I will be singular in terms of time/ philosophically one
- 3. The writer seems to interpret verse 4 as saying... He is our One focus, deserving of devotion
- 4. Verse 5 has a "therefore" character about it since He is "one" love Him singularly with all you have, mind, heart and soul not part of your heart, mind and soul

## III. The Proclamation - Dt. 6:6-9

- 1. These commands are to be in your hearts
- -not just your minds, or in your regulations serve Him with heart (soul)
- 2. What then happens?
  - A. You talk about them when you sit at supper
  - B. You muse about them when you lie down at night
  - C. You meditate, and contemplate these commands as you work the fields
- 3. Impress them on your children (verse 7)
- -as you would impress on them to love Alabama or Auburn
- 4. Tie them on your hands and foreheads

-phylactery is sometimes a bracelet or a plaque on the wall, or some even tied scripture in a small box on their heads

- -write them on your doorframes to see as you go in and out
- -write them on your "gates" the same idea

#### Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. Gates and doorframes speaks to our needs to be continually reminded
- 2. What happens if parents don't pass along the torch of devotion to God/ and His words?
- 3. The Bible has generational implications if we obey if the kids don't know the Word of God, how can they obey?
- 4. Two items:

First, love the Lord so much that He is everything

Second, love His commands and obey them - fanatically

- 5. Obviously loving God and being devoted to His word go together there is a new animal in the forest of 2020 to be able to love God, yet not know His words, and certainly not to obey them
- 6. Those who "obey" are often seen nowadays as "literalists" or "fanatics" -discuss

-a person who wears a "Jesus" t-shirt is a fanatic, but a person who wears a "beer" shirt is not

## IV. The Possession - Dt. 6:10-13

Rea 1. When God brings you in (verse 10) - don't forget Him (verse 12)

_	2. He swore this land to your fathers (Abraham, Isaac and Jacob)
Rea	-the promises of God are multi-generational
	3. The land will have many benefits:
	-wells you did not dig
	-vineyards you did not plant
	-houses you did not build
Rea	Their "inheritance" was not just the land - God gave them a "leg up"
	4. Don't forget
	-you used to be slaves in Egypt
	-serve Him <u>only</u>
	-take oaths in His name
Rea	The temptations:
	-to forget their past life without freedom
	-to serve other gods as well as Him - so we do not serve Him "singularly"
	-to swear by these other gods (common everyday use of other gods)
Rea	Ideas and Questions:
	1. They will go in - whether or not they deserve it, they will be given the land
	2. These are admonitions "as they enter" the land - for the future life
	3. How easy is it to forget?
	-we often forget the debt we owe to our forefathers, to our servicemen and
	women, to our parents
