I. A Commitment Expressed - Dan. 1:8-10

- 1. "Resolved" not to defile himself (verse 8)
 - -set his heart
 - -set it upon his heart
 - -a careful decision
- Rea -probably considered the possible ways it might go "south"
 - 2. "Defile" dietary laws

Leviticus 11

Rea -the food laws and the Babylonian names both are cultural "tainting"

- 3. "Royal food" and "wine"
 - -it would mean a compromise of his religious convictions
- Rea -walking the line between doing things that "compromise" and those that do not is difficult
 - -food offered to other gods
 - 4. The "official" (verse 9)
 - -chief eunuch
 - -Daniel had won "favor" with him
- Rea -he had won his respect and won his "ear"
 - 5. His fear that these would look worse than the others (verse 10)
 - -the king would have his head
- Rea -Daniel's courage affected others as well
- Rea -Daniel was a leader for the other youth as well

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. What difference would a little food make?
- 2. What are the issues you would "approach the king" (or your boss) about?
- 3. He and the others are far from home... who would ever know?

II. A Test Passed - Dan. 1:11-16

- 1. He approaches the guard who is over him (**verse 11**)
 - -but not just Daniel the three other youth as well
- 2. Please test your servants for ten days (verse 12)
 - -note that he phrased it as a test period only 10 days
 - -note that he called himself "servant"
- 3. The diet vegetables and water
 - -a vegetarian diet
- 4. Then "compare" (verse 13)
 - -there should be some "difference" between God's people and all others
- Rea -he puts the decision in the hands of the official then treat them accordingly Daniel "helped him" to test them
 - 5. He tested them (for ten days) (verse 14)
 - -this is their witness while they are in Babylon
- Rea -this physical success story would catch the eye of the official and the king
 - 6. Then the official examined them (verse 15) they were healthier
 - 7. The official takes away the king's food and gave them vegetables instead (verse 16)

-God gave them a small opportunity to witness while in a foreign country

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. Who would know if they just ate the king's meat?
- 2. Does this small thing really matter that much?
- 3. The eating of the king's food "meant" something what did it mean?
 -not eating the king's food "meant" something what did it mean?
- 4. One lesson if you honor God in a wilderness country God will give you good success

III. A Recognized Difference - Dan. 1:17-21

- 1. God gave knowledge and understanding of all kinds of literature and learning
 - -further Daniel could understand visions and dreams (verse 17)
- Rea -they were faithful with food so God gave them something better "knowledge" and "understanding"
 - 2. Daniel's understanding of visions and dreams foreshadows the rest of the book see chapter 2
 - 3. The chief official presented them to Nebuchadnezzar (verse 18)

Rea

- -another test
- -examining the fruit of their choices
- 4. He talked with them (verse 19) none were equal to them
 - A. Better than all the kings enchanters and magicians
- Rea B. They were faithful with food, and look how God rewarded them
 - C. Though they were far from home they were elevated in the king's service
 - 5. Better in every area of wisdom and understanding
 - 6. These Israelites were "better" (verse 20)
 - -verse 15 compared
 - -verse 19 they stand out
 - -verse 20 they outshine all the others

Rea We are known by our fruit - what a great witness for their Lord!

- 7. Daniel's tenure till the first year of Cyrus (verse 21)
- Rea -plots Daniel's ministry in history
 - 8. When we trust God we find wisdom and understanding
