- 3. Relevance when prayers are unanswered or slow

### 1. The Shameless Friend

- A. Unexpected guest:
  - -comes late at night
  - -common to travel at night
  - -kids are down and animals are inside
  - -culture was courteous demanded you rise and help
  - -Problem? it's late

At night:

- -worry more
- -depressed/ depression seems heavier
- -trials seem to pile up

Scary becomes scarier

Heavy becomes heavier

Worries become more real

- B. Settled in:
  - -feel safe
  - -abruptly awaken
  - -He does what is required gets up and helps
  - -now, must get food goes to his neighbor
  - -and begins to knock, and knock, and knock

### 2. Prayer as Pestering?

A. Have you ever been pestered?

By kids -mom, mom, mom...

By wives - nagging -husbands smother, parents hover

By sales people

By telephone sales people

By parents

By bill collectors

This man keeps knocking

-is prayer then, pestering God?

- -not a high view
- B. You say... Whatever happened to "thy will be done"

Is it okay to pester God? -yes

Same scripture that teaches us to pray for His will encourages us to keep on Didn't Jesus teach us not to use many words? - yes but, He was saying don't be like the Pharisees

- 1) Prayer in public
- 2) Prayer with vain repetitions go to your closet...
- D. Prayer that "pleads"

!!).

Charles Hadden Spurgeon - "pleading"

Prayer that asks again and again

Prayer that uses scripture and boldly comes to the throne again and again like a lawyer

We used to say:

- -pray through
- -prayer that holds onto the horns of the altar and will not let go
- -casts itself shamelessly at the feet of God

In the Old Testament Jacob wrestles with God all night - "I will not turn you loose until you bless me"

- E. How different are our prayers:
  - -a little poem
  - -a little meditation
  - -a little "say" a prayer
  - -a lighting of a candle
  - -a touch of a prayer cloth
  - -don't have time to pray

Have to ask you - <u>how earnest</u> is a prayer that is only uttered once?

- -it is earnest, fervent passionate prayer that avails much
- -prayer that weeps before God
- -prayer that is so intense that it fasts

# 3. The Comparison

A. A Bothered neighbor

God, My Father

- -the pestered neighbor gets up and answers
- -why? He's being pestered
- -by contrast... <u>you</u> have a Father who loves you and is glad to hear from you
- B. The idea? if that neighbor will help How much more...
  - -if God takes care of sparrows -how much more
  - -if God clothes the lilies -how much more
  - -if a neighbor would get up how much more your heavenly father
- C. Idea? He is NOT like a pestered neighbor
- D. Wants us to see God as a Good Father ready to answer

He may delay - but He is always on time

Tells us what to do when God doesn't answer - keep on praying!

What is the general idea?

#### 4. The Aim of the Parable

- A. An encouragement to pray
  - 1) Not just a little thought
  - 2) But continuous Ask, Seek, Knock

We give up quickly, we quit too soon-

Humbling to pray

- -even more humbling to pray and wait
- B. So... pray long -which raises the questions How long?
  - 1) Elijah prayed James 5:17
    - -used as an example of prayer
    - -one occasion at 1 Kings 17:17-24 a child had died
      - -prayed, went away
      - -prayed, went away
      - -prayed, went away

Her child is alive!

James 5:17 refers to -told Ahab it will not rain

3 ½ years it did not rain

Later, He asked God for it to rain

- -seven times he sends a servant to go and see
- -1,2,3,4,5,6, 7 a "little cloud"
- 2) Jacob wrestled with God all night

I will not let you go until you bless me

- 3) Daniel prayed
  - -great revelations dreams
  - -able to be secure in the lion's den
  - -awesome prophecies

Daniel prayed - 3 times every day

- 4) Jesus prayed
  - -prayed all night before disciples
  - -prayed regularly in morning
  - -frequently withdrew to pray
  - -40 days in the wilderness
  - -prayed about God's will
  - -prayed at the Mount of Olives
  - -John 17 entire chapter is Jesus' prayer
  - -prayer at Gethsemane in agony with blood -alone
- C. God is Not a pestered neighbor, He is My Father

<u>Disclaimer</u> - some did not have a good father

-or, he was not the dad you wanted, you needed

He IS the Father you never had

- -not a stranger a god out there
- -not a neighbor who can be pestered, would be annoyed

He is a Father -

But not just any Father

A good dad who really cares

A Father - but not just any father

He is my father

As you approach the door of prayer - may approach with confidence, you have a Father on the other side

-can keep on, because you have a Father

He is My Father

But that same God is Good Shepherd

-tenderly caring for sheep

-green fields

-still waters

-protection

-through the dark valleys

A shepherd who knows every hair

A shepherd who cares so much he leaves the 99

In the bible God is a loving Father

-see him waiting patiently for the prodigal

-waiting patiently

-watches over his family

A father - who wants relationship with us - actually pursues us

-reaches out and gives even His son
