I. Obey - Luke 19:29-34

- 1. At Bethphage and Bethany at the Mount of Olives (verse 29)
- 2. He sends two disciples on ahead
 - A. Go to the village (**verse 30**)
 - B. Find a colt never ridden
 - -Jesus may have known of the residents verses 30-31 suggest that the owner knew Him
 - C. If questioned say your master needs it (verse 31)
 - D. No question is asked as to the why an unbroken colt
- 3. The entire event shouts that there was supernatural intervention
- Rea 4. It speaks to the idea that the entry into Jerusalem was "planned" by Jesus
 - 5. They find the colt just as Jesus has said (verse 32)
- Rea -if He already knew the owner the supernatural knowledge takes a bit of a back seat
 - -it happened just as Jesus said (verse 33)
 - 6. For their part the disciples obeyed, and God made a way
 - -so the question becomes is this supernatural or not?
 - -the Lord needs it (verse 34)

Rea Ideas and Questions:

Rea

Rea

1. God makes a way as we go along - He does not give us everything today that we'll ever

need for the rest of our lives

- 2. The disciples simply did what they were told
 - -sometimes that's difficult
 - -we don't just go visit someone, we have to be certain that they will receive us well, before we go
- 3. "Obedience" is a strange word in our culture even in the church
 - -discuss why that is, and what have we lost by not knowing how to "obey" -we used to sing "Trust and Obey"

II. Praise - Luke 19:35-38

- 1. Brought the colt to Jesus (verse 35)
 - -cloaks on the colt, then Jesus
 - -it needed neither saddle nor bridle to accept Jesus
- Rea -possible that we are to see that the colt is obedient, just as the disciples were
 - 2. People received Him with cloaks on the road (verse 36)
 - -a gesture of reception and praise and submission
 - 3. Zech 9:9 predicted this event down to the "colt"
 - 4. Spontaneous praise from the people (verse 37)
 - A. Joyfully
 - B. Loud voices
 - C. "Blessed" (verse 38)
 - D. The "King" who comes in the name of the Lord
 - E. "Peace" and "glory"

-compare with Luke 2:14

- 5. Peace in heaven
- 6. Glory in the highest

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. Jesus' coming and reception both speak to the unfolding plan of God -right down to the lowly colt
- 2. How do we "receive" Him?
- 3. Do you see God's work "unfolding" in your own life?
 - -why or why not?
- 4. Not sure we even want a king
 - -we'd rather have a buddy
 - -we do what a Comforter
 - -we want heaven, but not the Jesus who won us heaven

III. Worthy - Luke 19:39-40

- 1. Pharisees rebuke your disciples (verse 39)
 - -rebuke these who give you praise
 - -not just quiet the people, but quiet their assertions about Him
- -the Pharisees are always there, just as in our world, the critics are always there
 - 2. Jesus' response (verse 40)
 - A. I tell you
- Rea

- -Jesus is "declaring" what would happen
- B. The very stones would cry out if they refuse to speak
- Rea -so, Jesus controls the stones?? creation
 - 3. This entering of Jerusalem is different from the other times this time He offered Himself as an atoning savior He enters purposefully, and dramatically as King

Rea Ideas and Questions:

- 1. He has His own schedule, but there is a time to offer yourself as Messiah -repeatedly (especially in the book of Mark) Jesus tells them to "tell no man"
- 2. Do you think they understood what it would mean for Jesus to be "king?"
 - -do you think that people understand what it means to be "saved" and baptized today? why don't they understand?
- 3. They cannot claim that they "missed" Jesus He offers Himself in a big way
- 4. If the president came to your town how would he be received? better than Jesus??
