Last son born

Pillars and homeland

Promised re-given

Rehearse covenants/ promises of God

Sons are listed

Back to homeland

Genesis 36 is Esau's genealogy (remember Jacob and Esau)

- 4. Chapter 35-36 are transitional chapters
- 5. At the end of chapter 35 Esau and Jacob (together) bury their father closure
- 6. Chapter 37 is the launching of the story of Joseph

Genesis 35:6-14

I. Called out of Shalem (1-5)

- 1. Go to Bethel build me an altar
 - -30 years have passed since the last time he was here:
 - -20 years with Laban at Padamaram
 - -10 years at Shechem (chapter 34)
 - -Shechem/ Shalem are the past... with it's rape, and gods... Bethel is their future
- 2. Tells household God speaks to Jacob/ Israel, not to the whole community... the leadership is vested in Jacob
- 3. Put away gods (2)
 - *-where did they come from?...
 - A) most likely the looting of the bodies of the people of Shechem after the murder of the rapers of Dinah
 - B) the earrings became the golden calf
 - C) Rachel stole Laban's gods
 - D) Make no other gods, have no other gods (Exodus 20)
 - -burv them
 - -put away sins... the past... a new land, under a jealous God
- 4. Altar (3)
 - -gave up their gods (4)
- 5. God put a "terror" on the surrounding nations
 - -fear of the nations at 34:30
- 6. God has always been with me wherever I've gone (3) here is his "hope"
 - -sometimes our distress is just to learn this... to learn of the "God who answered

me in the days of my distress"

II. At Luz (Bethel) (6-8)

- 1. Built an altar
- 2. Named "Elbethel" the God of Bethel
 - -a subtle change from the place, to the God of the place
- 3. Fled from brother and returns again at 28:19, named "Bethel" as he fled -so that I may "come again in peace" at verse 21
- 4. On his first trip to Bethel, God was "the God of Abraham and Isaac" (28:13) now Jacob is Israel (new name) and God reveals Himself further as "El Shaddai" a new name/ revelation (God Almighty)
- 5. Deborah dies (Rebekah's nurse) (8)

Deaths in chapter 35

- 1) Deborah here
- 2) Rachel at 19 "as her soul was departing"
- 3) Isaac at 29 "yielded up his spirit"
- *implies life after death in Genesis continuing beyond death

III. Remembering what God had Done (9-14)

- 1. Appeared at Padanaram (9)
- 2. Jacob to Israel (10)
- 3. I am God Almighty (11)
- 4. Be fruitful and multiply (11)
 - -God's continuing will
- 5. Land given (12)
- 6. God left (13)
- 7. Pillar raised (14)
 - -drink offering (poured out)
 - -oil offering (anointing)
 - -specific offerings are not given yet... but see Num. 28:7 for drink offering

IV. From Bethel toward Bethlehem (16-20)

- 1. From Bethel (16)
- 2. Rachel in labor -Benjamin to Rachel (his "loved" wife)
- 3. Hard labor
- 4. Baby born
 - -named "Benoni" (mom's name) means "son of my sorrow"
 - -named "Benjamin" (dad's name) means "son of my right hand"
 - So Benjamin has two names... not unusual... note:

Jesus is a man of sorrow and acquainted with grief... but also Jesus is the son of my right hand

- 5. Rachel died pillar (19)
- 6. Rachel's hard life:
 - -on her wedding night her husband was given to another
 - -lived in a jealous household (Leah)
 - -cherished the idols of her father (31:19)

-longed inordinately for another son (30:1, 24) but died when he was born

V. Beyond Edar (21-26)

- 1. Beyond Edar (21)
- 2. Reuben with concubine (22)
 - -Bilhah is the maidservant of Rachel the favorite wife of Israel
 - -remember Shechem and Simeon/ Levi
 - -Reuben is the firstborn... but he shames his father
 - -an affront to Jacob, but more so to God
 - -proper sexual boundaries set in Leviticus
 - -no motive is given, but seems to be for leadership/power
 - -did nothing... again
 - -at 49:3-4 Reuben lost his birthright over this
- 3. Sons of Israel listed 23-26

VI. Came to Mamre (27-29)

- 1. Came to his father Isaac
- 2. Isaac dies (29)
- 3. At the death of the old patriarch, Israel takes his place in the land of Canaan

As one life departed, another one began - 16-20

Enter "Joseph" (chapter 37)
